Commit to 3 sessions a week per subject.

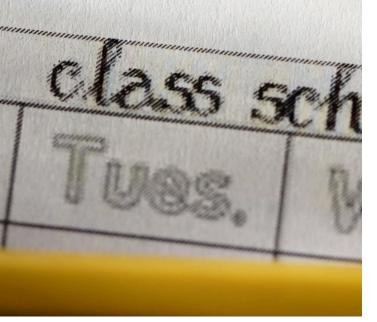
- Session 1 = 20 to 30 minutes: review concepts
- Session 2 = 20 to 30 minutes: worksheets, guided practice
- Session 3 = 40 to 60 minutes: independent practice

For SEA subjects include: 1) Math, 2) Spelling & Punctuation, 3) Grammar, 4) Comprehension, 5) Report Writing, and 6) Narrative Writing. You'll need to create a schedule that allows you to use your time wisely for both practice and revision.

Sometimes it's challenging to get a student settled and focused during study time, and that often leads to time being wasted instead of spent on what matters most - revision and practice.

Schedules provide topics and time management strategies like the Pomodoro Technique.

This method was developed by Francesco Cirillo in the late 1980s. Named after the Italian word for "tomato" (inspired by the tomatoshaped kitchen timer Cirillo used), the technique breaks work into intervals, traditionally 25 minutes in length, separated by short breaks. These intervals are known as "Pomodoros."

#	Total Study Time	Break Time	Best For
1	30 mins (with a 5-min break *actual study time - 25 min	5 mins	Quick review or homework check
2	60 mins (with 2 x 5-min breaks) *actual study time 50 min	10 mins	Light study days or subjects they enjoy
3	90 mins (with 3 x 5-min breaks) *actual study time 75 mins	15 mins	A full but manageable session for most children
4	120 mins (with 4 x 5-min breaks) *actual study time 90 mins	20-30 mins	Advanced learners or weekend/holiday revision



## APPLYING THE POMODORO

Set Clear Goals: Before starting, help your child decide what they want to achieve during their study session. Whether it's finishing a chapter of a book, solving a set of math problems, or memorizing a list of vocabulary words, having a clear goal will give them a sense of direction. It will also allow for the best use of time.

- **Use a Timer**: Set a timer for 25 minutes (or a shorter time if your child is just starting out). During this time, encourage your child to focus solely on their study task without any distractions.
- **Take a Break**: Once the timer goes off, it's time for a 5-minute break. Use this time to stretch, grab a healthy snack, or simply relax. It's important for the break to be screen-free to rest their eyes and mind, and to include some movement to increase blood flow to the brain so the child returns to study feeling refreshed, more alert, and ready to focus again.
- **Repeat the Cycle**: After the break, set the timer again for another 25-minute study session. Repeat this cycle for four Pomodoros, then take a longer break of 15-30 minutes.
- Celebrate Small Wins: After completing a full cycle of four Pomodoros, celebrate your child's effort! Maybe a small treat, an extra 10 minutes of playtime, or simply a hug and a few words of praise, "I'm so proud of you for getting your work done!" Celebrate their hard work to reinforce positive behavior, increase motivated.
